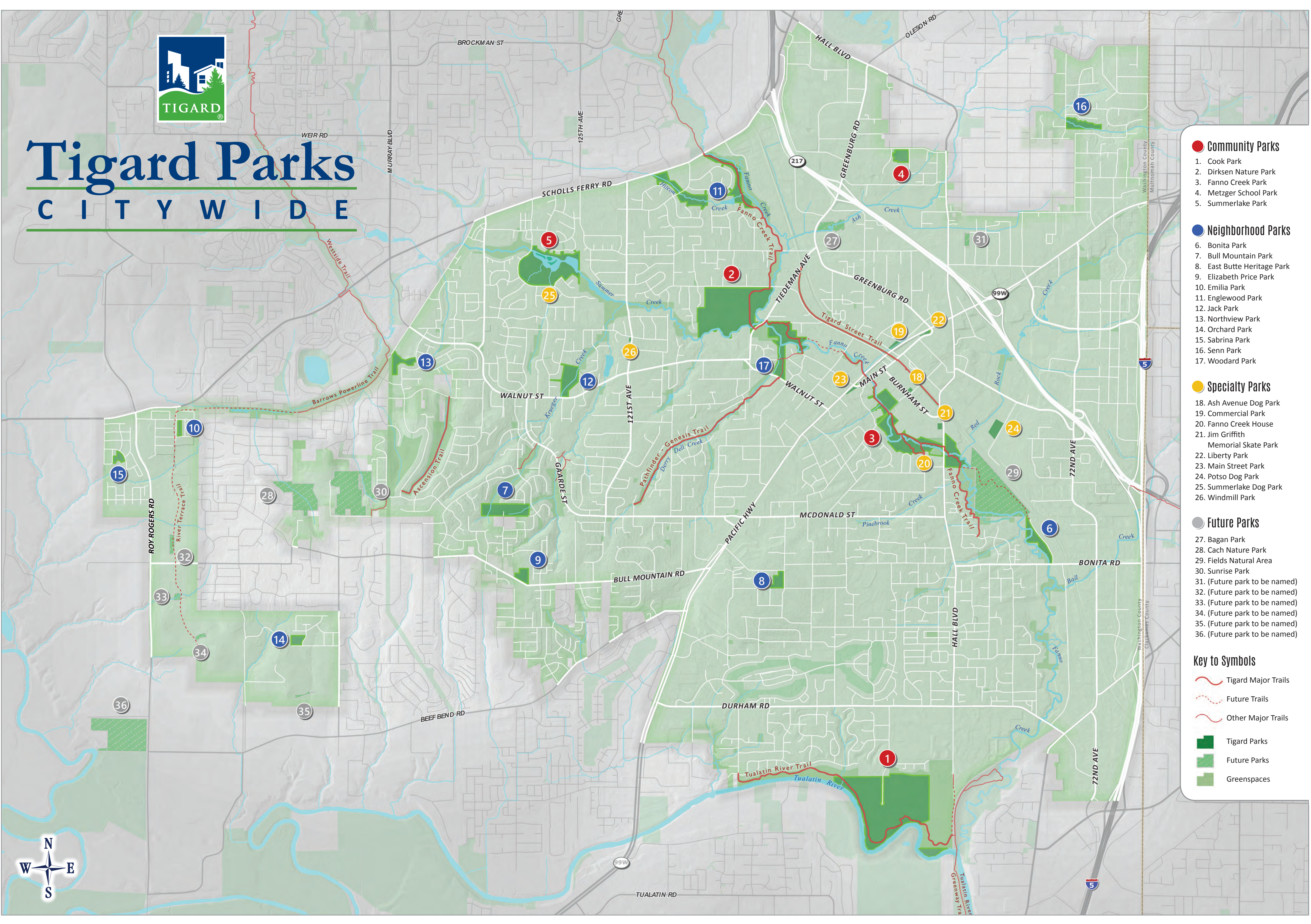

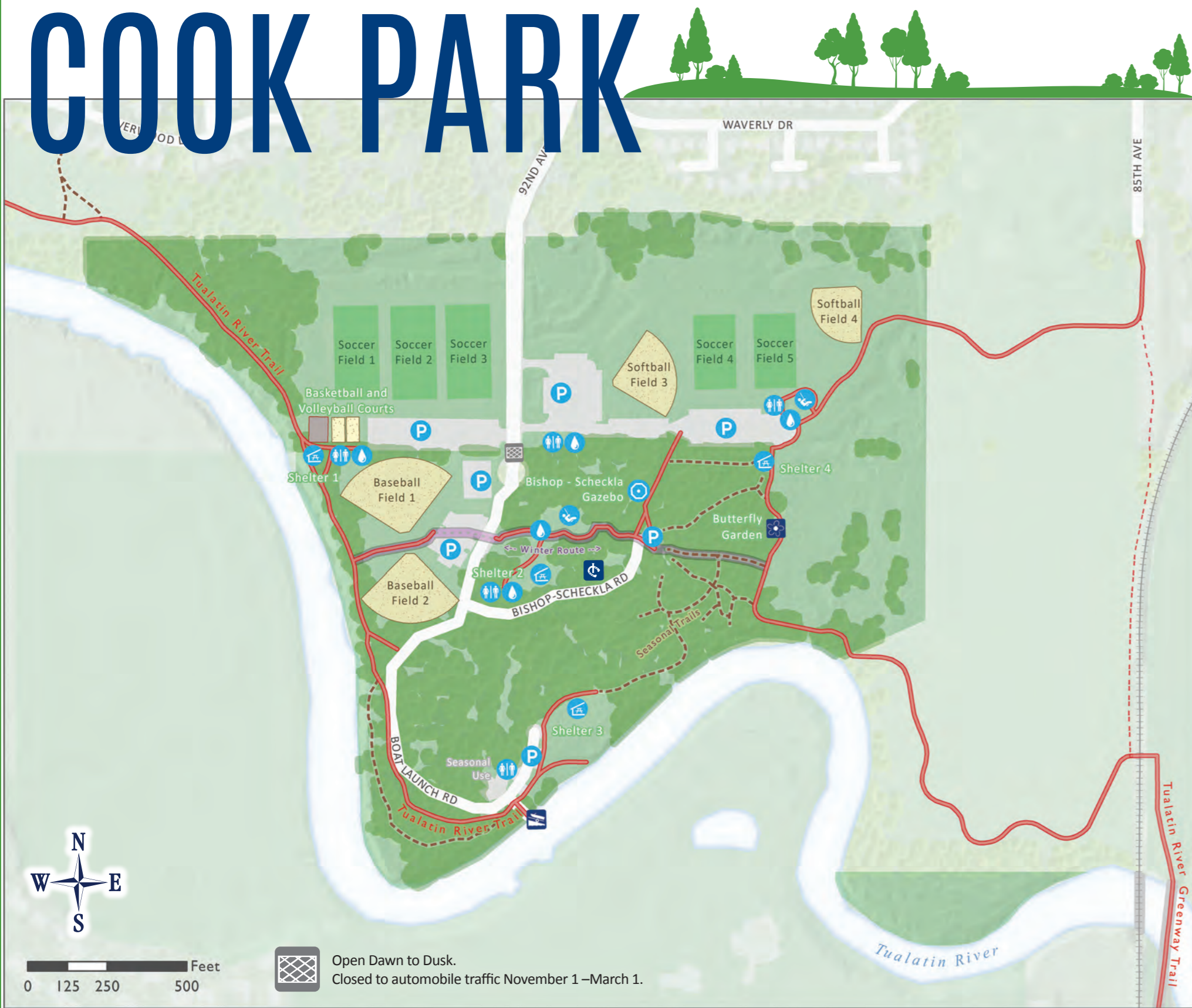

# COOK PARK



## Community Parks

- 1 Cook Park** (17005 SW 92nd Avenue)  
Here you'll find play structures for ages 2-12, hard and soft trails, and the Tupling Butterfly Garden. The riverfront location gives boaters easy access to scenic waterways. Five picnic shelters, along with soccer and ball fields, are available for rent.
- 2 Dirksen Nature Park** (11130 SW Tiedeman Avenue)  
Park offers a mix of mature forest, wetlands, outside gym equipment, and open space. The area is home to many species of wildlife and serves as an outdoor classroom for environmental education.
- 3 Fanno Creek Park** (13335 SW Hall Boulevard)  
This park stretches from Main Street in Downtown Tigard to the Tigard Public Library and offers trail-oriented recreation. There are more than 10 entrances to the park including one at the Tigard Civic Center.
- 4 Metzger School Park** (10350 SW Lincoln St.)  
Located on the grounds of Metzger Elementary School, an agreement between the city and school district allows for community use outside of school hours. Park development includes a community garden; plot reservations are available through the city at [www.tigard-or.gov/communitygardens](http://www.tigard-or.gov/communitygardens)

- 5 Summerlake Park** (11450 SW Winterlake Drive)  
Main features include the Sorg Memorial Rhododendron Garden and an off-leash dog park. The park also has two playgrounds for ages 2-12, hard and soft trails around the 7-acre lake, a picnic shelter that is available for reservations, restrooms, tennis and basketball courts, a small baseball field, and off-street parking.

## Neighborhood Parks

- 6 Bonita Park** (Milton Court @ Bonita Road)  
Borders Fanno Creek and provides opportunities for picnics, a playground for 2 – 12 year-olds, basketball, and wildlife viewing.
- 7 Bull Mountain Park** (17005 SW 92nd Avenue)  
Home to Tigard's first nature play structure, a picnic shelter and interpretive elements, the majority of this park is comprised of woods, open space, and riparian areas.
- 8 East Butte Heritage Park** (Canterbury Ln. @ SW 103rd Ave.)  
The historic John Tigard House is located on park grounds. This park includes trails, a small play structure, picnic tables and interpretive signage.
- 9 Elizabeth Price Park** (13001 SW Bull Mountain Road)  
Located on Bull Mountain, this 2.5-acre park is built atop an underground reservoir that serves Tigard's water customers. Among the park's features is a winding interpretive trail that leads to a viewpoint and compass inlaid in concrete.
- 10 Emilia Park** (13100 SW River Terrace Blvd.)  
Children's playground with climbing features and an open lawn area. Picnic tables and benches are also provided.

- 11 Englewood Park** (South of Scholls Ferry Rd at SW Springwood Drive)  
This is a walker's park with 2 miles of trails, including a segment of the regional Fanno Creek Trail. The 15-acre park is split into an east and west segment; each can be accessed by a short walk on Ironwood Loop.
- 12 Jack Park** (12420 SW 127th Avenue)  
A small creek bisects the park, which has two playgrounds, a community garden and open grassy areas. A trail and pedestrian bridge connects the northern section of the park with the southern section and the Walnut Street fire station.

- 13 Northview Park** (14250 Northview Drive)  
This quiet, 3.5-acre park is located in northwest Tigard on a small plateau with a view of Beaverton.
- 14 Orchard Park** (15305 SW Missouri Avenue)  
Named for a planted filbert orchard, this park includes a playground, open lawn areas and a basketball half court.

- 15 Sabrina Park** (17400 SW Sabrina Avenue)  
Youth and tot play areas; open lawn spaces, and a basketball half court.
- 16 Senn Park** (9852 SW 74th Avenue)  
This .2-acre pocket park is adjacent to a 4.5-acre green space. While the park is small, it accommodates a play structure and benches overlooking the green space.

- 17 Woodard Park** (10155 SW Johnson Street)  
This park is best known for its large oak trees and ponderosa pines. Several trails transverse the park, including a segment of the regional Fanno Creek Trail. Parking is available on Katherine Street.

## Specialty Parks

- 18 Ash Avenue Dog Park** (Corner of SW Burnham and SW Ash)  
Features include a dog-friendly wood fiber surface, shelter, concrete rings for exploring, drinking fountains for canines and humans, and a hose for washing paws and shoes.
- 19 Commercial Park** (Bordered by SW Commercial Street, SW Pacific Highway, and SW Center Street)  
This half-acre park near Downtown Tigard has a small play structure and a trail connecting Commercial Street and Center Street.
- 20 Fanno Creek House** (13335 SW Hall Boulevard)  
This special use area is situated on a 1.6-acre property along Fanno Creek.

# SUMMERLAKE PARK



- 21 Jim Griffith Memorial Skate Park** (13125 SW Hall Blvd.)  
This park is popular with skaters of all ages and is built for fairly advanced skill levels. Features include large flow bowls, a mini bowl, concrete dinosaur, volcano top, and street features.
- 22 Liberty Park** (North end of Main Street near the intersection with Pacific Highway)  
This park provides green space on the north end of Downtown and is the site of the annual holiday tree lighting ceremony.
- 23 Main Street Park** (South end of Main Street near the intersection with Pacific Highway)  
This park provides green space on the south end of Downtown.
- 24 Potosi Dog Park** (Wall Street off Hunziker)  
This is Tigard's largest with separate fenced areas for little dogs and big dogs; shaded picnic tables and benches.
- 25 Summerlake Dog Park** (11450 SW Winterlake Drive)  
Features include a shelter and water faucet for dogs.
- 26 Windmill Park** (Corner of 121st Avenue and Katherine St.)  
The windmill, preserved on its original site, is a visible link to Tigard's agricultural past.

## Major Trails

- 1. Fanno Creek Trail**  
A regional trail that extends 15 miles from Tualatin to Portland; the trail is a paved, multi-use pathway for walkers, runners, bicyclists and nature enthusiasts of all ages.
- 2. Tualatin River Greenway Trail**  
Follows the Tualatin River from the Ki-a-kuts Bridge through Cook Park to 108th Avenue. The trail is primarily paved, with a few short unpaved sections.
- 3. Tualatin River Water Trail**  
With a barely detectable current in the summer, the Tualatin River Water Trail is the perfect place for beginning paddlers and families with children.
- 4. Pathfinder-Genesis**  
This greenway trail is paved from 115th Avenue to Johnson Street. A boardwalk extends from Johnson Street to Walnut Street over a stream channel. From 115th Avenue to 118th Court there is a soft surface trail through a gorgeous stream ravine.
- 5. Tigard Street Heritage Trail**  
Formerly a rail line, this .75-mile trail connects Downtown Tigard to Tiedeman Avenue.
- 6. Ascension Trail**  
This .6-mile soft surface trail ascends 300 feet from Fern Street to the intersection of Mistletoe Drive and Ascension Drive.
- 7. River Terrace Trail**  
Trail is proposed to run from Scholls Ferry Road to 150th Avenue, with connections to other regional trails.
- 8. Summer Creek Loop Trail**  
Paved trail loops around Summer Lake with a few extensions into adjacent neighborhoods.
